Now,we would like to delete the delivery document. For your info. Del. doc is still open. We haven't gone for Goods issue or anything else.

So,we tried removing the batch line item in batchsplit tab of the delivery and then deleting the delivery document.

But we get the error message "Item category Not defined". but we could see entries for Item category Determination with the particular Delivery type *Item Category Group from Material Master* Item Usage+Item Category.

Why does system throw "Item category Not defined". when there are entries for particular determination available .
